

# **CONTEST NEWS**

#### Winter Field Day 2023 by Rick VE3BK

WFD this year had a few new rules but was still was a lot of fun. We all used our own calls from at home as we didn't have a Field booked like some of the Clubs in the USA. Our report was 1H for home station and our section was the new GH, Golden Horseshoe for us in Hamilton. Their number of stations and whether they were outside or not, could be told by the report they gave in our logs.

Some of us used the ARRL Field Day
Logging section of Writelog, which has been
used by our Contest Group for some time, so we
already had that program which worked fine for
reports and sections, but did not score correctly.
N1MM which is a free contesting program was
used by Spencer VA3SPN, had WFD in it and
scores correctly. We all had to make sure our
logs were put in by Cabrillo format (and both
programs did that well) and were credited to
Hamilton Ontario ARC, the way are club is listed,
so that the Club gets our total score.

Four of us from the Club were active for WFD, Spencer VA3SPN, Rick VE3BK, Mardy VE3QEE and our Contest CW Guru, Andrew VE3RIA who gave ONS or Ontario South for his section from Brantford. All the scores go toward the Club, even if we worked each other.

Spencer broke down his log like this, all on phone: 2 for 160m, 27 for 80m, 113 for 40m, 19 for 20m, 1 on 15m, 2 on 6m, 2 on 2m, 2 on 1.25m, and 2 on 70cm, for a total of 192 Contacts. He was more versatile than the rest of us and got a higher score with bonus points for running battery power.

So here is the break down as Spencer calculated. The points on my log that I attached previously are the points calculated by N1MM plus the 500 bonus points. I am unsure if N1MM calculated the points right though. When I manually calculate them I end up with 192 contacts x 10multipliers = 1920 + 500 bonus = 2420 total. I submitted the total from N1MM in case it pickedup something I missed. If it is wrong the WFD people can correct it.

He forgot the multiplier for the number of bands you work. N1MM gave the score as 19968 and of course he gets 500 bonus for battery = 20468. We will see when th WFD results come out.

Should be 192 x1 = 192 x 10 bands = 1920 + 500 bonus = 2420 N1MM correct.

Next is my log Rick VE3BK. All phone as well, 5 on 80m, 49 on 40m, 27 on 20m, 69 on 15m,. 8 on 10m with a total of 158 QSOs and 18 Multipliers. Score is 1 x 158= 158 x power factor for 100w>5w is 1, so still 158. Each mode per band is 5 x 158 = 890 total

SOAPBOX: Had fun doing WFD when I was on. Thanks to all that worked me. 73 Rick VE3BK

Mardy VE3QEE did both CW and Phone. CW scores 2 points. He had 3 on 40CW, 13 on 40PH and 5 on 20CW. So his points are 3 x2 =6 + 13 x1 = 19 + 5 x 2 = 29 x1 pwr mlt x 3 mode/bands =87 total points.

Andrew VE3RIA did 38 on 40CW, 92 on 20CW and 1 ON 10CW 131 QSOs x 2 = 262 x 3 bands =786 total score.

SOAPBOX: I had better conditions on Saturday than Sunday but still very active here. Its amazing how a 100w CW will still stir things up especially with a Canadian Call.
