Lastly, our members short of 20 people attended the Denny's Hamilton breakfast get together 21<sup>st</sup> October 2023.



Rick VE3BK was busy during the weekend on the World Wide contests.....read all about it...

This was a 48 hour Contest with many Hams all over the world involved. This is actually more of a World Wide get together of all the Contesters of the world.

In this Contest, the idea is to work as many Zones (CQ Zones) and as many different prefixes as you can. Same continent different Country (USA) is worth only 2 points but a multiplier for every different Zone or prefix. Same country (Canada) is worth 0 points, but you get multipliers for different Zone and prefixes again. DX stations are 3 points (anyone off our Continent) plus multipliers for Zones and prefixes, so the

points can add up if you only work multipliers only, pretty fast. The DX Cluster in my program tell me that.

Those of you who only work 40m, daytime, are missing out on all the DX fun in the wee morning hours. I was on 40m about 2:30am to 5:30am, working all DX multipliers only and having a ball doing it. People that think 40m is only an old man's daytime band, are sadly mistaken as 40m gets very long and quieter in the wee hours. Needless to say I was pooped at 5:30am and went back to bed for a few hours. My sleep always gets screwed up in this Contest, but I was having fun, name of the game. Back at it and did 15m daytime and had a lot of fun doing that. Signals were very good for this Contest.

You have to keep in mind that all Contests are different, the rules and the way you operate too. Also it depends entirely on the Band Propagation. If it is there and enough people in the Contest (like there is in this contest) you can have a lot of fun working strange Islands, Countries and DX you didn't know you could work. 10 meters was open and you can work the World on that band with 3 or 4 watts, so QRP will cut it on this band.

Some of the Contesters that are on a remote Island (a lot of them) will be running power (QRO) so if you go back to them with low power or QRP, they will not hear you and you won't break that pileup with all the Big Guns calling them. This is unfortunate for some bands and Contests. That is the problem with SSB.

This is a great contest to have some fun in. You do not have to enter a log or even work a lot of contacts. Just pick and choose the Countries or Islands you would like to work. Have fun on your Radio, I certainly did.

The results are not in yet but 3 of us used the Club call of VE3DC (we have become well known on the bands, with people asking us to go to another band because they know us
