
If you can help with communications for the Round The Bay Road Race call Fiore VE30QG. It is on March 29.

The Emergency Exercise of 14 February 87

On Saturday, February 14, several district hams, including members of the Hamilton and Burlington clubs, manned mobile and base station rigs to demonstrate emergency preparedness for OPP.

Staff Sgt. Augie Ketzler, OC Burlington Detachment, asked us to hit five radio dead spots his radio system cannot reach. He wants backup for two contingencies: communications into these dead spots, and providing communications in case of failure of base equipment, for which he has limited backup.

S/Sgt Ketzler joined about 20 of us for breakfast at the Harvest Table and then went to his HQ on the J.B. Hospital grounds with Ferg, LVO, to observe the exercise.

Our chaps scattered either to their homes to net-control on one of five frequencies or to the OPP-assigned spots to make good the various paths.

All went well. We had no difficulty making good all paths, even on 147.42 simplex, manned by Bob, OIP. Interestingly, Ferg LVO couldn't be heard outside the OPP HQ on simplex and the need for an outside antenna there was clear.

Others involved included Stan, GFE (DRW), Hugh, AYR (MBR), Robert, ANW (RSB), Jim, POP (PDX) Net Control Stations; Jack, ITO, Mort, KOT, Eric, AVE, Jacques, LJQ, and Les, EGT (driven by Victoria, ANW's MYL), who went to the OPP-designated spots to check into all five frequencies; Glenn, FHQ, who was overall NCS on NCF repeater. Several others came out to the breakfast and stood ready to serve but were not called on; grateful thanks to them too! Many mail-readers also offered help, especially Barry, CDX, who promptly drove to Burlington to explain the patterns and coverage of his prized PDX, a really potent repeater, to Frank, DPC.

The entire exercise, both base and mobile, was carried out on battery power.

Next steps are to assemble the logged information in the form of path maps to be provided to S/Sgt Ketzler; and to continue organizational work, particularly development of the phone fan to give OPP a one-call callout. Of course, we'll want to maintain a ready state with the occasional exercise.
