YOU PET HAM -CARE AND FEEDING

The pet Ham is one of the most intelligent of pets, Often seeming almost human. The following is a short guide to the things you should know about caring for your pet Ham.

LIVING AREA - Your pet Ham should have a private area of its own where it willnot be disturbed. It will spend many happy hours alone there with its collection of treasures (boxes, wires, bits of metal, glass, paper, plastic etc.). It should be encouraged to confine its activities to the nest room to protect the rest of the house from its natural tendencies towards noise, clutter and making holes in the walls.

EXPENSES - Raising your pet Ham can be an expensive hobby. However, unlike most pets, the pet Ham can be trained outside the home for short periods and bring in enough money to cover part or all of the expenses.

FEEDING - The well behaved pet Ham will be able to eat with the family on occasion, but it feels more comfortable and secure taking many of its meals in the privacy of its nest room.

HOUSEKEEPING - Pet Hams can usually be trained to use the family bathroom facilities.

OBEDIENCE TRAINING - Most pet Hams ccan be trained to rewspond to respond to a few simple commands. The easiest to teach are "sit" and "speak". Oncve your pet Ham has learned these behaviours, it will sometimes practice them on its own for hours at a time.
