That's right folks. Our contest group hit first place in the 1997 Ontario QSO Party. Bob Chandler, VE3SRE, of the ODXA organized the event. Dan VE3FBO, Emsley VE3JAI, Don VE3OCY, Steve VE3OZO, Rick VE3OZY, Ted VE3SS and Vic VE3VMO operating on several HF bands, 6m, 2m and 70cm handled 407 OSOs for a total of 38,665 points.
