Annual General Meeting and Elections, 16 June 2010

Notice is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting and Election of Club Directors will be held on Wednesday June 16th at 7:30 P.M.

The purpose of this meeting will be to receive Annual Reports from each of the standing committees, prepared by the various committee chairpersons, and to elect six members to fill positions on the seven-member Board of Directors for the Club year, 2010-2011. Joe Urbanski, VE3OCD has agreed to serve as election chairman.

The management structure of the Hamilton Amateur Radio Club is set out in the HARC constitution. Accordingly: "the affairs of the Cub shall be managed by a Board of seven Directors, each of whom, at the time of his/her election and throughout his/her term of office, shall be a Member of the Club. The Past President of the Club shall be ex-officio a Director and member of the Club. Each of the remaining six directors shall be elected to hold office from the 1st day of September, of the year for which he/she is elected, or from the date of his/her election if he/she is elected during the year, until the 31st day of August of the following year, or until his/her successor shall have been elected or qualified.The whole Board shall be retired on August 31st in each

year, but shall be eligible for re-election if otherwise qualified."

Each of the executive positions, namely: President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer is decided by the Board of Directors at an executive meeting taking place at a later date following the Annual General Meeting. The new executive will be installed at the September meeting.

To nominate a candidate for the Board of Directors submit your nomination along with the name of a seconder to the election chairman, Joe Urbasnski, VE3OCD. Nominations for the election are open now and will remain open until just before the actual election. Joe, the election chairman will be calling for nominations from the floor at the Annual General Meeting, and then he will declare nominations closed.

Persons eligible to vote must have been members of the club during the 2009/2010 club year. Nobody will be eligible to join the club at the Annual General Meeting and by so doing qualify to vote at that meeting. If you received this newsletter by mail you are on the membership list and are qualified to vote, except for advertisers and other non-members who receive the newsletter on a complimentary basis.

Help us toward a successful year by encouraging able and willing candidates to run for election. Give the names of candidates to Joe, VE3OCD.

Field Day, 27th and 28th of June 2010.

This year we will be operating a Field Day site at Bruce Park on Hamilton Mountain between Queensdale and Brucedale avenues, East of Upper James Street and West of Upper Wellington. It is a residential park with tall trees in one section. Our club will use a 4 Alpha designation, four HF transmitters on four bands drawing power from portable generators. In addition there will be a "free" UHF - VHF station and an SDR demonstration station.

Setup will take place Saturday morning. On-air start time is 2:00 P.M. local continuing for 24 hours.

If you are not officially booked in with a band captain you would be welcome to just drop around and say hello or try your hand at operating and /or logging.

The contest group plans to work the Canada Day contest on the statutory holiday Thursday July 1st from 00:00 Z to 23:59 Z, which translates to 8:00 P.M. John (Project #2) demonstrated that his antenna switch can be controlled by computer selection or manual over-ride.

Mark (Project #1) also prepared a video on his easy to use antenna rotator, with both manual and computer setting and a delayed brake feature.

Kevin (Project #3) presented his 2meter inverted-V made from readily available material.

Rick (Project #4) explained how a bazooka antenna and balun can be easily built.

Bob (Project #5) explained that over the past year he had discovered a radially polarized radio wave with the help of Sherry (VE3DCU) and Mardy (VE3QEE).

Mardy (Project #7) showed his elegant linearly loaded dipole for 80 & 40 meters. The dipole uses commercial plastic parallel-line cable for the 40 meter operation. The 80 meter response is then obtained by 'snaking' a single conductor through the parallel-line holes. The kit is sold by MapleLeaf Communications (Bob Morton's company).

The meeting broke at 8:36pm for refreshments while Casey tabulated the project votes.

Business Meeting began at 8:52 P.M.

Casey, VE3CVP, Awards Chairman, presented the Crawford Trophy to Adam Mitchell, VE3BAU, and Fred Robinson, VE3GCP, for their innovative EZ-Erect Tower.



People looking in should be impressed seeing the equipment and hearing us speak with similar stations all over North America and elsewhere if the bands are open. On the other hand, people looking in will be unimpressed seeing one of us doing something objectionable. Keep the location tidy. Don't drop garbage. Keep our activity focused on Field Day. Treat Field Day like what it is, an emergency preparedness rehearsal, not party time for us in a neighbourhood park.

Be aware of those activities that would normally take place in Bruce Park on a Saturday or Sunday if we were not there, because our presence could be preventing those activities. If our Field Day is interesting, neighbours will want to see. If our activity is annoying they will want to get us out of there. I guess what I am saying is, be full of care, that is, careful.

Leaving equipment unattended, and assuming that it should be OK, is risky. At the old place, out at Rock Chapel, there were relatively few people having access to the area. In Bruce Park everyone will quickly know about us. Someone should be at each location all the time.

The level of noise will be critical, especially at night. Don't forget we will have four or five generators going all the time, in an area where a hundred bedrooms back onto our site, and as many people will be trying to get some sleep, with the windows open in some cases, if it is hot.

Don't get me wrong I am looking forward to holding Field Day at the new location. I will do my best to be a good guest so that we will get an invitation to come back another year.

Examinations


Amateur radio license examinations are conducted the second Wednesday of each month, except July and August. Contact the voluntary examiners to make an appointment. There will be a fee for each examination.


The Hamilton Amateur











Above, John's VE3DVV, remote antenna switch and control unit. Below, Mark's VE3RYI, modified antenna rotator control box with computer interface circuit.


