admissions table are Ron Ouwehand and Mike Christmas, and the back vendor admissions table, Don Roop, Frank Love, and Andrew Hobson, Security on all of the doors is an job requiring a pair of eyes and a willingness to ask patrons to show proof of admission. Thanks to Mark Proctor who puts up roadway signs early on the morning of the flea market and collects them again at the end, and also to David Bruton who puts up the large round logos at the Fair Grounds. Mike Krebs has consented to man the VE3NCF talk-in again this year. We will have

an 80 meter station operating the ONTARS Net under the auspices of Barry Lisoweski while the flea market is on. Fred Robinson has once again has been working with Vendors to establish a prize program and Sherry Goeller and Adam Mitchell are assisting with prize ticket sales. Rick Danby, Renzo Conz, Jack Gauthier and Mark Proctor are assisting volunteers who show up at 6:00 A.M. to set up 100 tables for the event and take them down again at noon following the flea market. Walter Bayliss has consented to be flea market treasurer for this year. If you haven't a job already we can put you to work on the day. There are spots open to assist vendors finding their tables and providing security at the doors for a shift. From time to time other jobs pop up and it will be good to have people there to assist.

NEW EXECUTIVE. President David Bruton VE3DWJ thanked the outgoing executive and formally welcomed the new executive (listed previously).

OLD BUSINESS. Bob Zimerman VE3RKZ, informed members that the Ministry of Government Services requires that a "Notice of Change - Form #1 of the Corporations Information Act" be filed indicating the new officers of the club.. Documents relating to this matter were received by Mardy Eedson for completion and mailing.

NEW BUSINESS. Mary Urbanski, VE3OGQ, showed members a pamphlet from the Barrie ARC which outlined their club activities and which contained a membership application form. Our members felt a pamphlet like this would be a good idea for our club to produce for distribution at appropriate events like our flea market. Vital information such as our mailing address and web address could be included in the pamphlet. Sherry volunteered to produce and duplicate a similar document for the use by the Hamilton Amateur Radio Club.

Emergency Preparedness Exercise. Lorraine MacPherson, VA3NZ informed members that the City of Hamilton is conducting a simulated emergency exercise in November. The amateur radio community is officially recognized in the City emergency plan and a lively response will build confidence in our ability to provide assistance if called upon. Friday, Nov 5 at 9:15am is the actual exercise start. VE3RFI will be the primary repeater 443.250/850 tone 151.4. Jerry VE3JSO and Lorraine VA3NZ will be setting up and getting instructions about the scenario. The exercise will end at 12:00 noon.

Contest Program. Rick VE3BK announced the next contest for members is on October 30th and 31st, Halloween. It is the CQ World Wide DX Phone contest. Rick read the citations in QST and TCA where the contest group and where individual club members have been recorded. Rick presented individual and club awards for last year's contest to the participants.

Repeater Report. John VE3DVV showed the 440 radio picked up at Dayton this year. The radio is now mounted on a metal platform designed to fit the 19" rack at the repeater site thanks to the skills of Brian Bowie VA3BMB who designed and built the platform. It will be installed shortly.

Amateur Frequency Allowance. Lorraine VA3NZ raised the issue of the reported allowance granted to a commercial cycling group to use several 2 meter frequencies in the amateur band. Fred responded that this was an example of a bureaucratic blunder in which Industry Canada was in non-compliance with its own regulations. He anticipates this blunder will be corrected.

Field Day Report. Dan VA3DJ thanked everyone who participated in Field Day. It went off better than he expected and everyone had a great time. Dan said he looks forward to coordinating the event again next year and may implement some refinements as a result of his experience. We had a number of visitors to the site and also did well on the point count. Fred, as outgoing treasurer, commended Dan on his

Upcoming Special Event Stations

For those of you who like to collect special event certificates and QSL cards here are a couple of events announced in the RAC e-bulletin recently.

Special Event Station CG3MUG. "Thunder Bay MCTS Centre (Canadian Coast Guard Radio

Station) proudly celebrates 100 years of radio service. Built by the Canadian Marconi Company, in the fall of 1910, the new "wireless" station, MUG Port Arthur, was the first and only Canadian Great Lakes Marconi station ever built. In 1912, following the success of MUG, the Canadian government built a chain of marine radio stations from Port Arthur down to Kingston, Ontario. In 1913, the Marconi station was rebuilt, and assigned its current government callsign of "VBA". The "V" denotes a Canadian station, "B" is for the Great Lakes, and the "A" was given for its historic position as the first. During the month of November 2010, the Centre's Hams will be operating special event station CG3MUG, to celebrate our 100th birthday. The regular Amateur Radio callsign is VE3VBA. There will be several options for Amateur Radio Stations and SWL'ers to obtain a special 100th anniversary CG3MUG QSL card (a certificate may also be designed). As we get closer to the event, and make the final preparations, we will update the CG3MUG listing on the QRZ.com website.VHF and HF operation via CW, PSK, RTTY, SSB, FM, VoIP (CQ100) and perhaps other digital data modes, on the Amateur Radio bands. 


Jesse VA3JEZ accepting a contest award from RickVE3BK


September Meeting

Our Next Contest is the CQ World Wide DX contest the end of October.

This is the one we work as many Zones as we can to work the world. This contest is a lot of fun, if you like working exotic places, Islands and unheard of countries and areas. During this contest, someone always asks where that weird prefix is located. Many stations will be on the air for this one, which makes it such an enjoyable contest.
