and demonstrate emergency communications equipment. Also Mike VE3XMS who was there giving assistance as well.



it is property of the Club and must be returned to the Club shortly before the presentation the following year. A Crawford Trophy certificate is also presented to the winner.





Theme of this event was "Are you prepared for 72 hrs???" Something to think about. Rick VE3BK



The annual Paris to Ancaster bike race was well attended by racing participants and we had a good






occasions when assistance was required for distressed riders.


Thanks to Gary Notto and his crew for organizing the volunteer participation, and thanks to the many amateur radio operators who staffed the net.

David Schilling VE3XDS from the Mississauga ARC explains how he controls a remote HF station from his home computer.







