Secretary's Report

Minutes of the Monthly Meeting of January 15th 2014

- I. Call to order. Roger Pimm VE3UFZ called to order the regular meeting of the HARC at 19:05 on January 15th 2014, at Westdale Secondary School 700 Main St W, Hamilton, ON L8S 1A5
- II. Sign in. Attendance was not circulated. Visiting were Ed Spingola VA3TPV and Michael Brikell VE3TKI as our guest speakers.
- III. Introduction to our new meeting location. Roger Pimm VE3UFZ described the new meeting room to which we were present. We held our meeting in the cafeteria. He went on about the facilities and parking along with the classroom where we were to have our Basic Training course.
- IV. Basic training course. Roger Pimm VE3UFZ discussed the upcoming basic training course for new amateurs. He asked if anyone was interested in becoming instructors and to take a small piece of the training course to spread the effort all around. Volunteers were accepted. The cost of the course is 60\$.
- V. Speakers. At 19:12, Mike Christmas VE3XMS introduced our two guest speakers Ed Spingola VA3TPV and Michael Brikell VE3TKI. The came to our meeting to discuss IARU (International Amateur Radio Union) and QSL Bureau system.

Ed started the meeting explaining IARU which has 162 country members that report to the ITU (International Telecom Union) which was formed in 1925. The discussion was around the rules and regulations. Also added was the history of the union and the fact that it's pioneers were amateur radio operators like Hiram Percy Maxim.

The structure of the IARU is a worldwide system of QSL bureaus. RAC operates Canada. The way it works is that RAC receives QSL cards and then distributes them to all the provinces of Canada to which volunteers are assigned letters of the receiving call sign. The volunteers look for the person that is to receive the QSL card and then mails it to that person. This is

assuming that the recipient is paid up with the QSL bureau. Incoming QSL's can go to anyone however, outgoing QSL's require RAC membership.

At 19:34, Michael Brikell VE3TKI took over the meeting and described in detail about the Ontario QSL bureau and how it works. The Ontario QSL bureau is a shining light on how to handle QSL's as it is amazingly organized and online. One can go to http://ontarioincomingqslbureau.ca to view their account. The speakers then took questions and answered them. The evening was very informative.

20:15 was deemed the break time.--- 20:31 was when the meeting resumed

VI. Treasurer's Report. Dave Bruton VE3DWJ gave a report on the current financial situation for the benefit of club members in attendance. Dave Bruton further explained that financial reports would be delivered at the meetings but not published in the newsletter. This decision was made at the last executive meeting.

The contest is for 160 meter SSB only. We are limited to one transmitter. The best way to do this is to schedule operators in shifts one following another.

The published times are: 2200Z February 21 (Friday) to 2200Z February 23 (Sunday). In Local time that would be 5:00 PM on Friday February 21, to 4:59 PM Sunday February 23. A total of 48 hours. So there is lots of opportunity for you to choose a time slot and help us out for a while. Propagation is best after the sun goes down on 160 meters. It is a night-time band so we need operators to work the wee hours and the productive early-morning hours.
