I. Call to order Roger Pimm VE3UFZ called to order the General

Attendance was conducted by the circulation of the members' sign in sheet.

III. Membership

IV. Program

The program tonight was about how to use your handheld. Members and visitors brought their handheld transmitters to the meeting in order to show other members or to learn from other members how to program some features available on the radios.

Putting Up a Wire Antenna in Winter

suggestion by Mardy VE3QEE

Winter could be the best time for putting up a wire antenna if you are using one or more



trees for "sky hooks". The leaves are gone and you can pick a good spot where the branches provide a convenient V over which to drop a line. It is easy to pull up a wire once you have a line over the branch. Of course, these types of installations are best viewed as TEMPORARY for sooner or later the antenna will come down, but, if the line remains and the branch

He raised a HyEndFed antenna for 80, 40, 20 and 10 meters over his roof, and felt pleased with the results when he tested the antenna. The first contact made was with a ham in Alaska. It worked! The whole operation did not take long, only a few hours.


Remarks:
