Membership Report





RAC Insurance



In response to numerous questions I st Vice-President, Paul Fleck, VE3HTF, consulted the people in RAC headquarters who look after insurance. Here is a summary of the important points regarding RAC Insurance prepared by Paul.

Our club along with other Amateur Radio clubs in Canada subscribe to membership with our national organization, R.A.C. Radio Amateurs of Canada. One of the benefits to belonging to our national representative organization is the ability of clubs to secure reasonable liability insurance that protects our members and the club from potential claims arising from club sponsored or endorsed events where the general public may be in attendance. Such an example would be our Hamfest, the use of Hamilton Wentworth School facilities for teaching and meetings and Field Day. All of these events require proof of insurance before we can utilize those offered facilities.

So I have worked with our R.A.C. insurance representative to clarify what our R.A.C. insurance covers and put them into point form for our edification.

I. All paid members of the Hamilton Amateur Radio Club Inc. whether they are R.A.C. subscribers or not are covered by the R.A.C. liability insurance policy for club sponsored and endorsed events.

2. The coverage for liability is \$5 million dollars per claim.

3. The paid up R.A.C. member gets personal coverage for personal activities above and beyond his / her own personal insurance. Personal insurance is invoked first for any claim. (the club member who is also a RAC member receives 24/7 liability protection.)

4. Personal amateur radio equipment in personal car or at home / cottage is covered by a rider policy associated with ham's personal home and car insurance. (RAC's insurance program does not insure an amateur's radio gear or ancillary equipment.)

5. The Club's liability program thru RAC insures the Club and its' members for all Club sponsored and endorsed activities.

6. All HARC sponsored events should be submitted to R.A.C. insurance before the actual event outlining the activity and scope of the event. i.e.: Scouts camp and radio event, Christmas parade, club picnic, etc.

Contesting Tips by Rick Danby VE3BK

In response to numerous questions Rick offers some tips to help people who might want to make a contact or two during one of the weekend contests on HF.

One of the things everyone is unsure of is the Section Abbreviations used in the various contests. For example, what do we put in the log for Western Virginia? The abbreviation for the state of Virginia is VA so how do we designate Western Virginia ... WVA? No, actually it is WV. Each contest sponsor like ARRL or CQ Magazine, or RAC has a special list of abbreviations to be used in their contests. The lists are usually published in the contest rules.

During Field Day, which is coming up this month, and which is sponsored by ARRL, we have several larger states subdivided into smaller sections. Examples are Massachusetts. Note that: Eastern Massachusetts is EMA and Western Massachusetts is WMA, whereas in most other contests, it is just MA for Massachusetts. Another example is the state of California which is usually just CA. However for Field Day, California is split up into 10 sections with both 2 and 3 letter designations. You really need to download the list and keep it

handy for logging California stations.

In most of the other contests, the sponsors use 2 letter postal designations for each of the states and provinces. Depending on the contest, foreign countries, i.e. DX Countries, are listed with their normal 2 letter designation or, in some cases, just DX to keep the Contesting Program happy, whether it be Writelog, NIMM or some other popular program.

The ARRL Sections used for Field Day and the other ARRL Contests are found at: http:// www.arrl.org/contest-sections-list or at: http://www.arrl.org/ section-abbreviations

For many contests, the 2 letter postal designations are the most often used abbreviations but for some contests, all that is required is a serial number or for other contests it might just be your first name and call sign. Again, it depends on the contest rules.

To summarize, in every contest there is an *exchange* which contains the information we give to the other operator. We give them our *exchange* information and they give us their *exchange* information. The *exchange* is what we log to verify the contact. For Field Day the *exchange* includes a signal report, 5 9, and the ARRL section abbreviation.

For many other contests, (not Field Day) the usual abbreviations can be found at: http:// www.maww.com/PostCodes.html or at: http:// www.mapsofworld.com/usa/ zipcodes/ Try making a few contacts from home during a contest and you will get the idea.

Field Day 2015--

The American Radio Relay League (ARRL) conducts Field Day every year on the last full weekend in June, the 27th & 28th this year. Field Day is an opportunity for 'hams' throughout North America to gather in 'the wild' to practice their skills in setting up ad-hoc communications systems and calling as many other 'hams' as possible. Part emergency preparedness exercise, part contest, and part picnic, it's always fun.

This year the Hamilton Amateur Radio Club will be conducting field day operations at Valley Park in East Hamilton. We'll be at the east end of the Valley Park complex, where all the trees are. The closest entrance to the site is beside Hamilton Fire Station 17 at the corner of Isaac Brock dr. and Mud St. (Please don't park in the Fire Station's parking lot!) There is limited parking on site, but we are hoping for additional nearby parking. You can also access the site from the Valley Park Recreation Center's main parking lot, a short walk or bike ride along paved pathways.

All members are encouraged to attend, whether as participants bringing their stations out to the field, or as operators providing short relief periods for those on the air, or even just to visit and cheer on the participants. Bring family and friends and show them you're not the only one with strange devices in the basement that make strange noises.
